Sexual harassment of a minor by an adult in a formal role of power occurred at a local sport organization (LSO).

System System onditions that

In the absence of a reporting/response process, the LSO Executive Director was forced to build one with minimal time and resources, before the club could receive the complaint and hold a disciplinary hearing. The club's existing code of conduct did not define sexual harassment, increasing the challenge to adequately address the issue. The hearing resulted in the Respondent being formally sanctioned, but the local and provincial sport organizations had no formal systems to enforce the sanction across the province, resulting in the Respondent only being banned from "home" games.

Despite formally accepting the sanction, the Respondent regularly emailed LSO staff requesting to be fully reinstated. As the PSO has no formal authority to apply sanctions, the Respondent was able to usurp the sanctions and officiate "away" games. Ultimately, the commitment demonstrated to safe sport by the LSO was rendered ineffective to safeguard participants due to the absence of a system to effectively respond to complaints and uphold sanctions.
